TREES OVERHANGING SIDEWALKS AND STREETS

As we continue our efforts to beautify our community, procedures have been established to ensure quality of life is maintained throughout our City. In an effort to ensure our city streets and sidewalks remain clear, the city would like to remind each resident of the minimum heights necessary for overhanging trees. The minimum height for trees overhanging the streets is 13’6”’. The minimum height for trees overhanging sidewalks is 7 feet. Proactive compliance is greatly appreciated. Progressive Waste Services will pick up limbs and brush if it is bundled and not exceeding four feet in length, under 50 pounds per bundle, and placed on the curb.
