PLANNING & ZONING COMMISSION APPOINTMENTS

The City Council will appoint three interested members to the Planning & Zoning Commission during the June 12th Regular Council Meeting. This is a voluntary, two year term. Responsibilities include review of platting and construction of new homes and businesses prior to Council review. If this interests you, please complete a volunteer application available at the Municipal Complex and submit it to the City Secretary.

ALLEYS AND RESPONSIBILITY

Code of Ordinances Section 6.05.003 states that trees must be trimmed to 13 feet 6 inches from the ground and grass and brush must be cut back to the fence line. Do not attempt to trim limbs near power lines. Tree branches encroaching on power lines must be reported to TXU Electric at 1-800-242-9113.

CAPITAL IMPROVEMENT PROJECTS

The Tanny Street project is now substantially complete, with some minor clean up and repairs yet to be finished. The Carb Drive and Holloway Street project is underway with the initial work being started to place the underground utilities on Holloway Street. We anticipate both streets to be completed by late fall 2012. The next project is Aton Avenue West, which is currently in the design stage.

A SPECIAL OLYMPIC HONOR

Police Officer Jeramey Miller had the honor of carrying the Special Olympic torch at the University of Texas at Arlington Maverick Stadium on Friday, May 25. He works closely with the Committee and volunteers throughout the year to help bring local community activities and awareness to this important organization.

RESULTS OF ENVIRONMENTAL COLLECTION DAY

Forty households participated in the Spring Cleanup, which included 1087 pounds of environmental waste and 650 pounds of recycle waste collected. Thanks to all of our residents who took advantage of this very important event.

STAGE 1 WATER RESTRICTIONS HAVE ENDED

The Tarrant Regional Water District (TRWD) lifted Stage 1 watering restrictions on May 4, 2012. Tarrant County water supply is currently over 95%, thereby allowing the TRWD to lift the restrictions. If lake levels drop below 75%, the TRWD will announce further action to limit water usage. The City's Code of Ordinance Article 13.07.032 prohibits irrigation by underground or portable sprinkler systems on any day between 10am and 6pm. Water conservation continues to be encouraged to avert further drought conditions. Twice per week (or less) lawn irrigation is sufficient to maintain a healthy and beautiful landscape. Infrequent irrigation promotes healthy growth as roots dig deeper to find nourishment. Your lawn will grow stronger and healthier as a result. Remember, rain substitutes for watering, so re-set your sprinklers according to weather conditions. For information, please access www.savetarrantwater.com.
