STREET CONSTRUCTION UPDATE

We are nearing completion on Tracyne West and both sides of Aton Avenue. All that remains is correction of a few issues discovered on the final inspection. The City Council awarded the contract for reconstruction of Tracyne East and Colman Drive at the November meeting.

We anticipate construction to start in early December. Additionally, the Council authorized engineering to begin for the 2015 projects on Watters Place, Wells Circle North and South, and Randolph Court.
