LOW COST PET VACCINATIONS

Saturday, February 13, 2016

Town & Country Veterinary Clinic will provide a pet vaccination clinic from 10am to 12pm at the Public Works Maintenance Building on SH183 at Koldin Lane. New residents must register all their pets and have them vaccinated annually. Vaccinations include Heartworm, Rabies, DHP, Parvo, and Bordetella. Rabies vaccines are free with purchase of discount packages. You may register your pet(s) at any time with the Police Department.

ILLEGAL PARKING

Code of Ordinances, Chapter 12, Section 12.04.033 - Parking on public streets or alley.

- Obstructing traffic. No vehicle shall be parked on a public street in a manner that obstructs the flow of traffic on the street.
- Obstructing use of driveway. No vehicle shall be parked on a public street in a manner that obstructs normal use of any driveway except with the permission of the owner or person having control of the property. In any case where permission cannot be clearly established, no vehicle may be parked in such a manner.
- Obstructing alley entrance or exit. No vehicle shall be parked on a public street in a manner that obstructs normal entrance to or exit from any opening of any alley.
- Parking on or across a curb. No vehicle shall be parked on a public street with any part of the vehicle resting upon or across a curb.
- Hazardous parking. No vehicle shall be parked in such a manner as to present a hazard to persons or property.
