### GREASE IS A HAZARD TO OUR HEALTH

Residents should never dispose of cooking grease or cooking oils by washing them down the plumbing system or the storm drain. Oils pollute our streams and creeks by forming a film on the water surface and prevent oxygenation for aquatic life. Polluted water runoff can lead to severe State and Federal fines. As sewer pipes back up, food and sewage particles accumulate to create a health hazard by attracting insects and vermin. Soak leftover amounts of cooking oil with a paper towel and throw it in the trash; filter and freeze to reuse for another meal; or recycle cooking oil by calling the Fort Worth Household Hazardous Waste Collection Center at 817-871-5257.

***A Message from the Water Utility Services.....***

**AVERAGE WINTER CONSUMPTION 2017**

Each winter you have the opportunity to lower your sewer costs by conserving water.

We average all residential customers’ consumption to establish a new city wide sewer average during the winter months (December, January and February). The major reason for this is that residential customers are not watering their lawns during this time frame, so water usage is primarily inside the house. The greater part of the water used during the winter months is entering the sanitary sewer.

During the upcoming winter months conserving water may possibly minimize your sewer charge.
