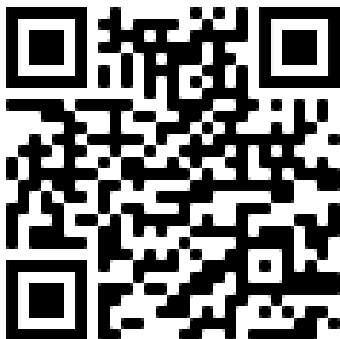

A Letter from Mayor Jones

Fellow Citizens:

As we approach the dog days of summer, your city government is hard at work. A general update is in order.


First, please join me in congratulating and welcoming our new city administrator, Brandy Barrett. Brandy performed admirably as the interim administrator last year, and we know she will do an outstanding job for our citizens in her new dual role as city administrator/city secretary. The city is in good hands.

The playground equipment for Melva Campbell Park has been ordered! We will soon be finalizing the park's drainage plans, and accepting bids for the park's concrete work.

We expect to receive the comprehensive citywide drainage study and recommendations from the city's engineers within the next 30 days. The city council and the long-range planning committee will be quite active evaluating the various options and funding requirements to address these long-term issues.

Our typical summer budgeting process continues, and I expect the council in September will adopt yet another balanced, "in the black" budget, providing all essential city services without a tax increase.

Water Conservation

As summer continues and the temperatures soar, so can your water bill and the water loss impacts to the environment. The Fort Worth water department offers these tips on how to save:

- Water when it's needed. Sign up for the Weekly Watering Advice (waterisawesome.com/watering-advice-choices). You will get an email or text that lets you know how much water your yard needs each week based on weather service data for your zip code.
- Make sure your irrigation system is working properly and efficiently. Get the help of an irrigation professional to learn how to use your irrigation system.
- Always follow watering restrictions.
- Don't water by irrigation or sprinklers between the hours of 10 a.m. to 6 p.m. You'll lose up to 50% of that water you are paying for to evaporation.
- Consider using native and adapted plants in your landscape. They use less water and can still thrive during periods of drought.
- Pools utilize a lot of water. Visit <https://www.fortworthtexas.gov/departments/water/savefwwater/residents/pools> to see ways you can save.
