Chief's Message

As the Chief of Police for Westworth Village, I am pleased to present our 2016 Annual Report. Our mission as an organization is to serve the community with Professional, Vigilant, and Courteous service, with an overall goal to create and maintain relationships that will continue to make Westworth Village a better and safer place to work, visit, and enjoy life.

Along with the hard work of the members of this department as well as community partnerships and support create the quality of life the residents of Westworth Village enjoy.

2016 has been a year of forward momentum for the Westworth Village Police Department. During 2016, there have been many of the changes within the organization which better utilize existing resources be better serve our residents. These changes have enabled us to take a proactive approach in reducing crime and traffic safety issues in the community. The report also includes a statistical review of reported crime, calls for service, traffic data, and crashes.

Accomplishments in 2016:

Westworth Village celebrated its 75th year as an incorporated City with a citywide celebration and fireworks display, car show and time capsule which is to be opened at the 100th Anniversary Celebration in 2041.

Crime rate: In 2016 there was a slight increase in part one crimes as compared to 2015 and 2014 due to our improved reporting practices. Comparing 2016 to previous years, we continue to maintain one of the lowest crime rates in the area.

TPCA Best Practices Recognition Program: The Texas Police Chiefs Association began this voluntary accreditation program a few years ago to assist law enforcement agencies in meeting their professional obligations. The process requires agencies to meet or exceed 164 standards of best practices in law enforcement. The Westworth Village Police Department is creating and implementing new policies and procedures in order to become a TPCA Best Practices Recognized organization.

Mission Statement and Core Values

Our success in community policing is based in a policing philosophy which proactively addresses crime and the fear of crime through a shared relationship with its citizens and officers. The mission of the Westworth Village Police Department is achieved by using proven problem-solving methods, which are built upon community involvement to create a quality of life desired by all. We understand no police department can solve crime or quality of life issues alone. However; effective police- community relationships are built upon open and transparent communication, and most importantly, citizen engagement and the trust of the public in the police.



Our sense of duty is demonstrated in our relationships with each other and to the citizens we serve. This has been accomplished through encouraging a positive, supportive environment in order to protect and serve the community's quest for a peaceful and safe existence, free from fear, with democratic values applied equally to all citizens.

Police Operations



The Westworth Village Police Department is comprised of 14 full time Sworn Officers and 4 Police Dispatchers as well as 1 Administrative Assistant. Additionally, Westworth Village PD has 5 Reserve Police Officers and one citizen volunteer, making this a great community

to live in and enjoy. Patrol comprises 80% of the police force. These officers are the most visible and recognizable section of the police department, operating 24 hours a day, every day of the year. These are the officers you see patrolling your neighborhoods and businesses, and the first to respond to an emergency.

In order to effectively provide coverage throughout the city, patrol works 12-hour shifts with both day and night shift coverage. Traffic enforcement as well as proactive patrol operations is one of many responsibilities of patrol officers. High Visibility enforcement serves as a proactive crime reduction strategy as well as a proven technique to reduce motor vehicle crashes injuries and deaths within our community.

Communications Unit

The Westworth Village Police Department's communications center is staffed 24 hours a day 7 days a week by professional state licensed Public Safety Telecommunicators. In 2016 our communications center handled 23,338 calls for service and officer initiated proactive police activity, 2,019 of these calls were received via the Tarrant County 911 System. In addition, 12,129 calls for dispatched for the Lakeside Police Department.

Criminal Investigations








The Department has two members assigned to criminal investigations. They work closely with the Tarrant County District Attorney's Office as well Municipal Court to ensure the rights of both the victims and the offenders are protected. Simultaneously conducting investigations leading to the prosecution of criminal cases for offenses occurring in our community. In 2016, the Unit was assigned 604 cases and achieved an 84.7% clearance rate.

Community Policing

Community policing is the cornerstone of a safe community. The Westworth Village Police Department is committed to building and maintaining relationships with the community. This year the City of Westworth Village celebrate its 75th year as a incorporated city. The 75th Anniversary Celebration was a great success! The events included an antique car show and community block party. Both events were well attended and our Officers and support staff did an excellent job of keeping the citizens safe and well informed during the events.
