3. Staff Updates:

A. Doug Reim, Police Chief

- Police Dept & Municipal Court Reports are consistent year-to-year.
- ECA Training: Final study sessions continue; expect all to certify next month.
- PD Vehicles: Two new vehicles, with new logo design, are expected to be rolled out in 30 days.

B. Ryan Studdard, Code Enforcement

• Code Enforcement Report: 32 code violations were addressed in May. Ryan discussed property on Kay Lane that is under foreclosure. The City cleaned up the lot and boarded the house. Liens for expenses have been placed on the property.

C. John Rodriguez, Fire Chief

• Fire Dept Report: New format for reporting with monthly summary and operations updates.

D. David Curwen, Director of Golf

• Golf Club Report & Events Calendar: Course was closed one day in May for aeration. A second assistant pro was hired. Eight events were held over nineteen days, in May.

E. Roger Unger, City Administrator

- Capital Projects/Infrastructure: Carb/Holloway project went extremely well. The handicap ramps on Tanny are being redone at the contractor's expense. Engineering on Aton and Tracyne is in the design stage.
- **Budget/Disbursements:** Variance report shows PD overtime in dispatch to due vacancy and sick time; attorney fees are up due to WRA litigation.
- Library Report: Pending meeting with Burleson regarding the library consortium.

- A. Finance Committee --Kelly Jones, Chair The City is in sound financial condition. Kudos to Roger Unger for his work on budget.
- **B.** Fire Dept Consolidation Committee –Kelly Jones, Chair Chief Rodriguez is making positive changes to the department, as evidenced by the new reporting format.

Discuss and take action on recommendation from P&Z Commission regarding Site Plan Review for the Dunkin Donuts, to be located at 6700 Westworth Blvd.

- Staff and P&Z Commission have been working with representatives for several months. City Administrator Roger Unger and P&Z Chair Melva Campbell both recommend approval. Business is expected to open in early October.
- MOTION to accept recommendation from the P&Z and approve the Site Plan for Dunkin Donuts made by Kelly Jones. SECOND by Nick Encke. Motion passed unanimously by a vote of 4 Ayes and 0 Nays.

G. Mike Coleman

Discuss and take action to adopt Ordinance No. 342, replacing Chapter 4, Article 4.03, of the Code of Ordinances, to include solicitation and panhandling activities.

- Admin Specialist, Brandy Barrett, stated that the ordinance revision addresses the manner, times, and locations of how solicitation can and cannot occur within the City.
- MOTION made to adopt Ordinance No. 342, as presented, made by Mike Coleman. **SECOND** by Nick Encke. Motion passed unanimously by a vote of 4 Ayes and 0 Nays.

H. Mayor Yeager

Discuss rental units in single family zoning districts.

• It has come to the attention of staff that there are homes within the City that have backyard sheds or trailers being used as rental property. These units do not fall within current zoning code, nor do they have appropriate and separate utility services and Certificates of Occupancy. Mayor Yeager, Roger Unger, Ryan Studdard, and City Attorney George Staples need to investigate further, with regard to health and safety laws and zoning restrictions, before bringing it back to Council. No action taken.

I. Mayor Yeager

Discuss and take action to formally constitute a Vision Committee and name members thereof.
