A. Kevin Reaves, Police Chief

- **Police Department Report:** 2054 CFS, including 324 911 calls, and 151 Priority-One calls. This is a 34% increase in calls from this time last year. 488 traffic stops resulting in 435 violations and 321 written warnings. 40 arrests. 163 warrants were cleared via Police Departments and Court actions.
- Life Saving Awards: Life Saving Awards were given to Officer J. D. Lee and Officer Jeremey Miller.

• National Telecommunicator Week Proclamation: Jill Patton read the National Telecommunicator Week Proclamation and Samantha Milligan, Elizabeth Wheeler, Cindy Black, Clay Paris and Breanna Wilson were recognized for their dedicated service to the community.

B. Nader Jeri, Building Official

- Code Enforcement Report: 41 Code Warnings / 0 Citation compared to 0/0 this same time last year.
- **Inspection Report:** 88 Inspections, compared to 51 this same time last year.

C. Rhonda Hines, Librarian

- Library Report: Veterans Resources Day was a success; 11 attendees, and 3 service providers.
- Patron visits this month total 278, compared to 197 this month last year.
- Rhonda announced her resignation to the council, she will be relocating with her family to Oklahoma. She was thanked for her hard work and dedication to the City.

D. Tony Collins, Parks & Golf Operations Supervisor

- Golf Club Report: 3514 rounds, \$185K revenue, 56 Preferred Players. The course was closed 0 days due to weather, and Range Revenue continues to be positive.
